

## European Journal of Theology (EJT): Change of publisher – action required

Dear members and friends of FEET,

AlphaGraphics, the publisher of our journal, the European Journal of Theology (EJT), has decided to stop printing it. The reason for their decision is not that the Journal is not viable, but that they want to focus on their core activity (printing) without investing in new software for administration. At our request, they will hand the publication of the Journal to Amsterdam University Press (AUP).

The decision by AlphaGraphics to stop publication will take effect after April 2020. Those of you who subscribe to EJT will receive issue 29.1 (April 2020) from AlphaGraphics. Yet you have already paid for all of the year 2020 (and maybe for subsequent years as well). AlphaGraphics is willing to arrange a refund of these subscription fees.
